

The 2012 AGM of International Billiards & Snooker Federation took place at Sofia Princess Hotel in Sofia, Bulgaria where elections were conducted for the position of President. Jim Leacy of Ireland was elected as the new President of IBSF by winning the election by the margin of 2 votes and he replaced Mr. Pascal Guillaume of France.

HISTORY OF RIBSA

The modern RIBSA (Republic Of Ireland Billiards & Snooker Association) was started in 1959 at a meeting in Paddy Fenelons House in Dublin with **Paddy Fenelon**, **Jimmy Grace**, **Jimmy Connelly** and his son Jimmy Junior.

At this meeting it was agreed a new format was required to encompass the numbers outside Dublin who were playing. Prior to 1959 the IABA organised only two tournaments restricted to the top 16 and the new association was seen as a dramatic new development.


The first president of the Association was John Short from Dundalk and the Committee **Jimmy Grace** Hon Secretary, **Tommy Bisset** Hon Treasure, **Paddy Fenelon** and **Tony Duff**.







The Early Years

Representative Snooker & Billiards started in earnest in 1969 with the very first International Against Wales. In 1970 Republic Of Ireland players competed in the World Amateur Snooker Championships.

In 1972 the first modern International Open Tournament was staged by **Finbarr Ruane** and **Gloria Ruane** called The **Christopher Carroll** Tournament.

In 1985 RIBSA took part in the first Junior Internationals and In 1987 a new committee structure began with the provinces having representation on council.

Following this came today's calendar of events for Billiards and Snooker in Senior, Junior and Ladies event all over the country.

In the 41 years since the Association was formed, Many people contributed to helping RIBSA to have its present position in the scheme of European (EBSA)and World Snooker (IBSF)

Paddy Comerford was a former President of the Association and his contribution to Snooker and Billiards is legendary in the sport.

Paddy and others have died along the journey but they will never be forgotten like **Paddy Thornton**, **Paddy Williams**, **Finbarr Ruane**,, **Bill Trulock**, **Dermot Dalton**, **Miko Bodkin** and many others have all worked in making RIBSA what it is today and we are now Ranked N0.3 in the World IBSF Country Rankings.

RIBSA Hosting International Tournaments

The Republic Of Ireland Billiards & Snooker Association over the years has hosted a number of successful major International events such as in 1974 and 1984 when we hosted the World IBSF Snooker Championships.

The Ivy Rooms Snooker Club in Carlow was the venue for most of the events run by RIBSA after that as in 1997 when RIBSA held the World IBSF Under 21 Championship.

In 1999 & 2012 RIBSA held the IBSF World Billiards Championships. In 2002 the European U-19 Snooker Championship and In 2004 we held the World Under 21 Snooker Championship. In 2006 we held the European Team and in 2007 we held the European Senior Snooker Championship. The World Under 21 Championship were held again in 2010 at the Northwest Snooker Club in Letterkenny Co Donegal. The latest International Snooker event staged was the 2013 IBSF World Men, Master and Women Team & 6 Red Snooker Championships. This was the biggest event ever held by RIBSA with competitors from over 30 Counties involved, which included 46 Irish players in the events.

World Amateur Snooker Championships Review

IBSF World Amateur Championships

Pascal Burke was the first Republic Of Ireland player to make his mark at the World Amateur Championships coming 3rd in 1974 in South Africa.

Gay Burns also finished 3rd in New Zealand In 1986.

In 1989 a young **Ken Doherty** Won the World Championship in Singapore. In 1990 **Stephen O Connor** retained the World Championship for Ireland in Sri Lanka .

RIBSA almost won it three times in a row when **Jason Watson** finished 3rd and **Joe Canny** 4th after both lost in the semi finals in 1991 in Thailand.

In 2003 **Brendan O Donoghue** finished 3rd in China In 2008 **Colm Gilcreest** finished Runner Up in Austria and in 2010 **Rodney Goggins** finished 3rd in Syria making a 147 break in the Championship.






IBSF World Junior Championships

RIBSA players have performed exceptionally well in the World U-21 Championship over the years with **Ken Doherty** winning the title in 1989. In 1999 **Rodney Goggins** won the World U-21 while in 1998 **Robert Murphy** reached the U-21 final.

Vincent Muldoon reached the semi finals in 2005 in India and 2010 in Ireland while **Josh Boileau** reached the World U-21 final in UAE in 2013

IBSF World Masters Championship

Joe Delaney (Wexford) reached the final of the IBSF 2005 Masters Championship. In 2012 Mark Tuite Reached the semi finals as did Alen Matic in 2015. Ger Delaney & Alan Cusack reached the semi finals of the Team Championship in 2013







European Amateur Snooker Championship Review

At European level the inaugural meeting was held in Antwerp and was attended by **Finbarr Ruane** and **Paddy Thorton** and RIBSA were honoured at this meeting with the appointment of **Paddy Thorton** as Chairman but sadly he died within months.




European Championships

On the table our players have had excellent results over the years in EBSA events with **Rodney Goggins** reaching the final and **Vincent Muldoon** finished in 3rd place in 2007 in Carlow

In 2009 The Republic Of Ireland Association sent 3 players to the European Championship in Belgium.

This proved to be a very successful for RIBSA with all





European Team Championships

The Republic Of Ireland team has won the 2008 European Team C-Ships with Martin McCrudden, Brendan O Donoghue and David Hogan in Scotland and Robert Murphy & Michael Judge in 2015 in Malta.

European Junior Championship

In the European Junior Championship **TJ Dowling** Won the Title in 1997. **Vincent Muldoon** reached the final on two occasion in 2006 & 2007. In 2014 **Josh Boileau** reached the final and two years later in 2016 **Josh Boileau** won the European U-21 title and qualified for the WSA professional tour.

European Masters Championship

RIBSA players have won the Masters title on three occasions with **Eugene Hughes** in 2000, **Joe Delaney** (Wex) in 2001, **Mark Tuite** in 2014. **Brendan Thomas** reached the final in 2016.

European Master Team Championship

Joe Delaney and Patsy Farrell won the Masters Team Title 2004 title and Joe Delaney and Brendan Cooney Reached the final in 2009. In 2013 Mark Tuite & Anthony Bonnar won the Championship.





RIBSA Coaching Academy

The RIBSA Coaching Academy was initially set up by Terry Griffiths in 1997 at the World Under 21 Snooker Championships in Carlow.

Terry Griffiths was the Director of WPBSA Coaching and ran a seminar to qualify a number of RIBSA coaches and shortly after **PJ Nolan** was appointed RIBSA National Coach

RIBSA now run Seminars based on the Coaching Ireland & Irish Sports Council approved coaching syllabus to train snooker coaches at Intro level.



Coaching Ireland has now replaced the

NCTC as the governing body of all coaching in the Republic Of Ireland

The seminars are open to any paid up member of the Republic Of Ireland Billiards & Snooker Association and registration forms are available from the RIBSA Office and online via our web site on www.ribsa.ie.

The Candidates who attend the seminar will receive training in coaching skills to coach players in the basic skills within their local club, they will then act as talent scouts within the Republic Of Ireland Billiards & Snooker Association.

In 2011 RIBSA held the first Level 1 coaching course to qualify coaches within RIBSA to the next level within Coaching Ireland. This Syllabus is being updated regularly to allow RIBSA to hold these seminars. **Liam Moggan** from Coaching Ireland assisted RIBSA in launching the two day Coaching Ireland / RIBSA level one course in Carlow.







PJ Nolan became the first Irish man to be appointed an official W.P.B.S.A. World Snooker Coach after receiving a scholarship from World Snooker in 2010.

Ken Doherty was the first Irish Junior to really break through at the World Junior Level and he was followed over the years by Joe Delaney, Stephen O Connor, Anthony O Connor, Paul O Donoghue, Rodney Goggins, Robert Murphy, TJ Dowling, Martin McCrudden, Brendan O Donoghue, David Morris, David Hogan, Vincent Muldoon and Josh Boileau have all progressed to play Senior International snooker for Ireland.

More National Junior Champions include Robert Redmond, Cameron Fidgeon, Michael Mullen, Brendan Byrne, Jonathan Grant, Trevor Dunne, Tom McKeown, Jason Waters, Damien Shoer, Tom Hogan, Philip O Connor, Stephen Reddington, Jason Devaney, Sean Conway, Greg Casey, David Cassidy, Aaron Tobin and Ryan Cronin

In 2009 & 2010 RIBSA set up an Elite Squad for the most promising juniors to receive coaching and free entry into event for the complete season. **Josh Boileau**, **Tom Hogan**, **Andrew Doherty**, **Aaron Tobin**, **Kenny Wight**, **Dylan Scully**, **Stephen Bateman**, **Ross Doyle** benefited from this scheme and it is hoped they will continue to progress.

In 1997 TJ Dowling won the Pontins Festival. In 2008 **Jason Devaney** won the Junior Pontins Festival and the Junior Pot Black Title in the Crucible in Sheffield. In 2009 & 2014 the **Republic of Ireland Juniors** team won the Celtic Snooker Challenge in Wales



New Juniors have come on the scene like **Charlie Sweeney**, **Jason O Hagan**, **Fergal Quinn**, **Corey Ramsbottom**, **Sean Devenney**, **Eamon Harkin**, **Adam Fitzgerald**, **Aaron Goldrick**, **Ross Bulman**, **Ronan Whyte**, **Noel Landers**, **Aaron Hill**, **Darragh Cusack**, **Ryan McGuirk**, **Patrick Daly**, **John Landers**, **Aaron Smith**, **Ronan McGuirk**, **Gavin O Donnell**, **Adam Quinn**, **Oisin Bateman**, **Leone Crowley**, **Alex Currid**, **Noel Gleeson and Luke Bateman** to make the next chapter as exciting and RIBSA will help them all to become the future Champions.

National Senior Snooker Championship Review



The first Rep Of Ireland National snooker final was in 1931 and was won by Jack Ayres.

A look down the list of champions you will see some of the all time greats of Irish Snooker. Each year the event has got bigger and bigger and nowadays the National Senior Champion is offered a place in the IBSF World Amateur Championship.

In the early years a few players dominated the championship with players like **Seamus Fenning** winning it six times in 1933, 1935, 1939, 1949,



1954 and 1955 and he also lost in three finals. **W. Browne** won it three times 1952, 1956, 1961. **PJ O Connor** won also won it three times in 1937, 1942, 1951 and **Jack Rodgers** won it in 1963, 1964 and lost two finals in 1966 and 1967

In the modern era only one player has won it four times with **Martin McCrudden** winning it in 2001, 2009, 2010 and 2014. Four others have won it three times like **Dessie Sheehan** in 1969, 1970 and 1980. **Jason Watson** won it in 1991, 1992 and 2002. **Vincent Muldoon** won the title in 2007 and 2008 and 2012. **David Morris** is the only player to win it three years in a row in 2004, 2005 and 2006.

A number of players have won it twice **Eugene Hughes** in 1978 and 1979. **Pascal Burke** in 1974 and 1976. **Gay Burns** in 1985 and 1986. **Ken Doherty** in 1987 & 1989. **Joe Canny** in 1996 and 1999. **TJ Dowling** in 1997 and 1998 and **Brendan O Donoghue** in 2003 and 2015.

Other great champions have won it once **Fergus Murphy** in 1973, **Jim Clusker** in 1977, **Paddy Brown** in 1982, **Jimmy Long** in 1983, **Paul Ennis** in 1984, **John Buckley** in 1988, **Stephen O Connor** in 1990, **Mick Kane** in 1994, **Tom Gleeson** in 1995, **Rodney Goggins** in 2000 and **Jason Devaney** in 2011.

This Championship is still the one all players want to win and have their name on the cup with all the other great champions.

David Morris won the championship three times in a row and was presented with the old perpetual cup. Jim Leacy donated a new cup in memory of his father.



The 147 Breaks





Martin McCrudden, Rodney Goggins and David Hogan followed John's break in making the perfect 147 break in RIBSA ranking events in Carlow in 2002, 2006 and 2013.

During the 2010 IBSF World Amateur Championships in Syria. **Rodney Goggins** became the first player from Ireland to make a maximum 147 break in an International event.







Professional Snooker

To play Professional Snooker is the dream of many players when they start playing the game and for some of our National Champions their dreams came through.

Ken Doherty won numerous events including the World Professional Title in 1997 and Fergal O Brien won the British Open in 1999. Eugene Hughes won the World Cup with Alex Higgins and Dennis Taylor in 1985, 1986, 1987.









Joe Delaney & Patsy Farrell and Mark Tuite & Anthony Bonnar won the European Team Championship



The first Rep Of Ireland Masters Championships was held in 2007 and it was won by Eugene Hughes. Each year the Masters Championship has gotten bigger and bigger and a look down the list of other champions you will see some great former Irish Champions.

In 2008 Kevin Monroe beat Richie Nolan, In 2009 Brendan Cooney beat Richard McHugh, In 2010 Richard McHugh beat Anthony Bonnar, In 2011 Mark Tuite beat Frank Sarsfield, In 2012 Tom Gleeson beat Brendan Cooney, In 2013 Mark Tuite beat Marty Hayden. In 2014 Colm Gilcreest beat Frank Sarsfield and in 2015 Colm Gilcreest beat Johnny Farrell.

The IBSF World Master Singles Championship has also been successful for the Irish with Joe Delaney reaching the final in 2005 and Mark Tuite reached the semi final in 2012 in Bulgaria.

The IBSF Masters Team Championship is a new event that has been introduced by the IBSF and Alan Cusack & Ger Delaney reached the semi final in the inaugural year.

The Irish Masters team compete in the Home Internationals each season and with seven RIBSA ranking events plus the Championships it is always exciting to see who qualifies.

With so many of our top senior players



reaching the 40 age group it bodes well for more success for RIBSA in the years to come.

Ladies Events Review



The first Ladies national Championship was in 1978 and was won by **Maureen Butler** from Fairview. The players competed for the Marie Rogers Perpetual Cup.


The Championship has run every year since, yielding many great champions and some

excellent international players.

Mary Raymond from Pioneers in Dublin won it 3 years in a row from 1979-1981. Other notable champions are

Ann McMahon from Dublin who has lifted the trophy 5 times, winning it in 1994, from 1999-2001, and again in 2005

Margaret O'Driscoll from Limerick won the cup 4 years in a row from 1987-1990



With a total of 7 titles to her name **Julie Kelly** from Wexford holds the 2nd highest amount of championship wins, winning it from 1991-1993, and then from 1995-1998. Julie went on to become the World professional ladies 9-ball pool Champion in the USA in 2000.

With 10 titles under her belt to date **Michelle Sherwin** from Q's S.C. in Dublin is by far the most successful Irish female player to date. She won the title in 2003 and has retained the title from 2006 - 2015.

In 2008 Michelle was presented with the Marie Rogers cup after winning it 3 years in a row. Michelle then



herself donated the current shield 'The Edward and Annastatia Sherwin Memorial shield' in memory of her mother and father.

Michelle has also won the Home-Internationals with **Paula Judge**, and has reached the semi-final of the World and European Championships. Michelle still competes and hopes to add more national titles to her name. Other winners of the ladies championship were: **Lorna Connolly**: Peirrot, **Bernie O'Sullivan**: Sully's, **Celine Burke**: Bray S.C., **Martina Wendell** Kings Cross and **Cathy Dunne** from Celbridge S.C.

Throughout the years the championship has had some brilliant matches, there has been much laughter and tears along the way, but there can be no doubt that it is the event every snooker player looks especially forward to competing in year by year on RIBSA events.



Billiards has been played in Ireland since the nineteenth century, even beyond. The first recorded Championship, in pre-Republic days was held in 1902, the winner is recorded as **Maurice Fitzgerald**. A notable example of the standard of play at the time was the (in those days, All-Ireland) 1902 Championship held in Strabane, when local player J. Duncan defeated J. Brady in the final, making breaks of 167, 123, 123, 114, 103.

The first Championship after Partition was held in 1928 and from then to the start of the more modern era, the game was dominated by no more than about a dozen players, most notably multiple winners Seamus Fenning (7 times Champion), Mick Nolan (5 times), Larry Codd (4 times), Jack Ayres and Tommy O'Brien (3 times each), K. Smith and Jack Bates (twice each). From about 1970 onwards, multiple winners, all of whom are still active in the game today, include Eugene Hughes (8 times Champion), Larry Drennan (6 times), Aidan Murray (5 times), Victor O'Gorman (4 times), Dick Brennan (3 times) and current Champion Rodney Goggins, 3 times.

It is notable also that in the early days, most players played competitively in both Billiards and Snooker and a check through the archives will reveal a number of names that have achieved top honours in both games. Only three players however, are in the records as having achieved both Billiards and Snooker Championship titles in the same year. They were Jack Ayres (1931), Seamus Fenning (1935, 1949) and Eugene Hughes (1978).

The Irish National Billiards Championship, in keeping with the World Championships, is now contested in two formats, the Long-up game, now 750-up, and the short format game, being the best of 5 games of 150-up.

Today, there is a core of approximately 20 players competing in the Senior Billiards series and a further 20 or so contesting the Intermediate, handicapped series.

RIBSA have made efforts to introduce a Junior Billiards Ranking series and a National Championship during recent years. It was won by **Ross Doyle** who



is the younger brother of **Wayne Doyle** who in 2014 was the Irish Senior number 1 billiard player and one of the stars of the future in the game of Irish Billiards.

Of late, the games of Billiards and Snooker have tended to drift away from each other, with the top proponents concentrating their efforts on their chosen game. This is understandable, given the very full calendar of events, particularly in the more popular

game of Snooker.

This is something of a pity, bearing in mind the skill levels achieved by our top Snooker players, there is no doubt that with their cue skills, they would quite certainly excel at the three-ball game.

By way of confirmation of this assertion, there is one player, **Rodney Goggins** who, in addition to his outstanding achievements at Snooker, is also the 2014 Billiards Champion and the first ever Billiards Double National Champion, having won the Championship in both formats.



Rodney's achievements at Billiards have not gone unnoticed in Snooker circles. Billiards, for all its similarities with the game of Snooker, has, in its greater variety of strokes, a particular fascination of its own. Perhaps Rodney's successes may persuade some of our top Snooker

players to try their hand at the skilful game of Billiards.







The Irish Billiards Teams regularly compete in the World Billiards Championships, The Home Internationals, The four Nations Championships. Over the years RIBSA have won the Tri-Nations in Northern Ireland in 2003 and won the Home International title in 2011.

The RIBSA Senior tournaments are organised by **Brendan Devlin** and the RIBSA Intermediate tournaments are organised by **Liam Byrne** each season. The success of Billiards in Ireland most go to them both in promoting this special game of Billiards.


